ROAR is rooted in four generations of farming the Santa Lucia Highlands and has become synonymous with benchmark wines of the region. Our wines strike a balance of power and elegance that capture the energy of our windswept appellation. Our vineyard-driven approach is expressed in a focused portfolio of estate-grown Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, and Rhône varietals.

After years of selling fruit to quality-minded wineries, we founded ROAR Wines in 2001 to deepen our connection to our land and refine our farming through winemaking. This holistic approach, where each vineyard decision is guided by what's best for the wine, has helped elevate both our estate properties and the wines themselves, earning recognition across the winemaking world.

Our vineyards are meticulously cared for year-round by a dedicated crew of 40 experienced professionals. Each vine is hand-tended every 14 days, ensuring precise care throughout the growing season. Grapes are harvested entirely by hand at peak ripeness, allowing their inherent character to shine. In the cellar, we take a gentle approach to winemaking to preserve purity, letting the vineyard speak through the wine.
